

Chicken Apron & Wristlet

Level: Easy



<u>Apron</u> Instructions:

Read all instructions before beginning your project. Refer to photos for placement. *See close-up photos, next page.*

Preparation:

Trace chickens on pockets with dark graphite and pencil.

Painting the Design:

Chicken: Black. **Wing** - Comma Strokes w/6 shader & **Highlight:** White + Black. **Waddle & Comb:** Tomato Spice. **Eyes, Beak & Legs:** Pigskin. **Background Dots:** Use Large Round Style Stix and Royal Plum. **Small Round Style Stix dot in center:** Dark Goldenrod. **Stripe Around Pocket:** Leaf Green w/16 shader. **Corner Squares:** Tomato Spice 16 shader. **Stripes on edge of apron:** Black w/16 shader.

Penwork: Add double wiggly lines to everything. I added double lines on top of *Leaf Green* stripes, and around background dots.

Woodsies Heart: *Tomato Spice.* Using Hand Drill, place hole in center top of Heart. From inside of pocket, using needle and string, bring string through first beak. Place string through hole in heart and tie in knot. Sew down through second beak and tie knot inside pocket.

Jumbo Craft Sticks: Paint according to list. Drill hole in top of each stick. Using needle and string, sew through first stick and stitch to apron top. Bring string over apron top and through the front of next stick. Continue through each stick. Tie knots at both ends.

Wristlet

Instructions:

Read all instructions before beginning your project. Refer to photo for placement.

Preparation:

Trace pattern on wristlet with dark graphite and pencil.

Painting the Design:

Chicken: White - Use Small Style Stix to add Black dots to body. Comb and Waddle: Tomato Spice. Beak and Legs: Pigskin. Bow around Neck: Royal Plum - Highlight: Use dirty brush + White and overstroke "fat" parts of Bow. Background Swirls: Leaf Green.

Penwork: Add double wiggly lines around everything.

Woodsies[®] Flowers:

Large Circle: Liberty Blue. Plaid: Thinned White using 6 shader. Small Circle: Royal Plum. Dots: Tomato Spice. Small Square: Pigskin. **Oval:** Olive Yellow. Strokes: wash English Yew.

Glue all together according to picture. Drill hole in top of Circle, and tie Flowers to zipper pull. ENJOY!











